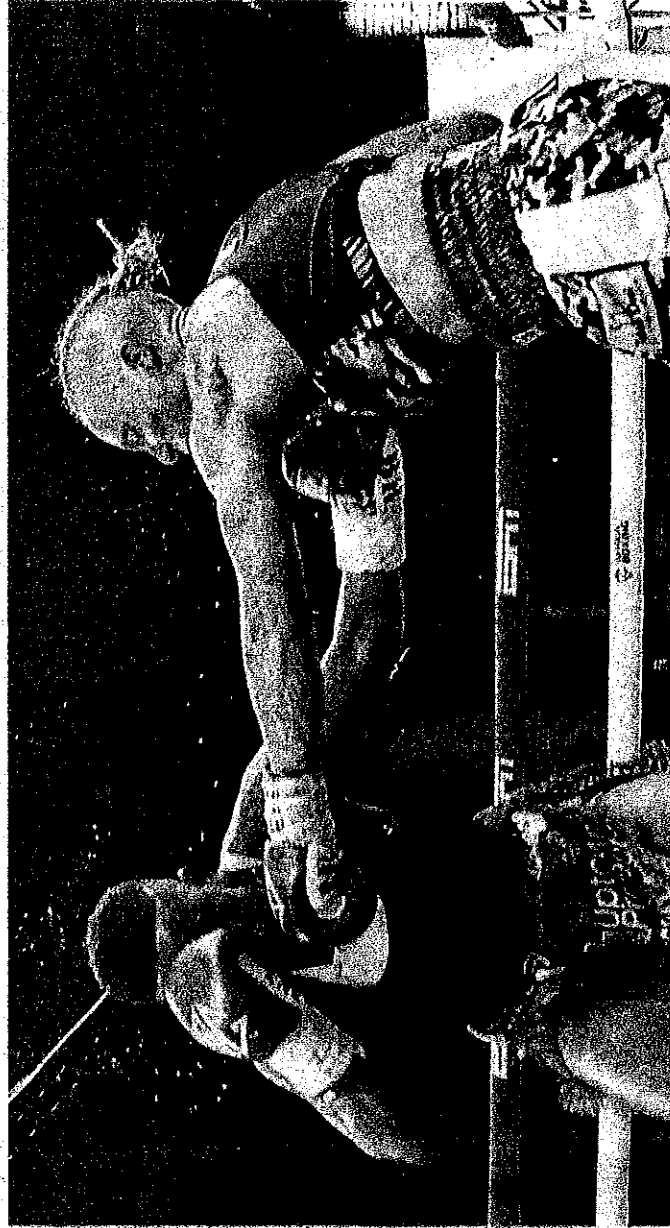
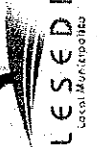


Punishing bout stands to win female fight of the year
